AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE INCLUSION OF CERTAIN CALL FIRE FIGHTERS INTO THE RETIREMENT SYSTEM AND PENSION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 4(2)(b) of Chapter 32 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by striking out at line 253 all language, after the words
3 "that the board," continuing through line 261, and inserting the
4 words "subject to the rules and regulations promulgated by the
5 commissioner, shall fix and determine how much service in any
6 calendar year is equivalent to a year of service for all reserve or
7 permanent intermittent police officer or a reserve, permanent
8 intermittent or call fire fighter was on his respective list and was
9 eligible for assignment to duty subsequent to his appointment who
10 do not become permanent police officers or fire fighters.

The Constitution of the State

Section 1. The legislative power shall be vested in the Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2. The Senate shall be composed of members elected by the people for terms of four years, one-third of the number shall be elected in each year, and the number shall be fixed by law.

Section 3. The House of Representatives shall be composed of members elected by the people for terms of two years, one-third of the number shall be elected in each year, and the number shall be fixed by law.
