AN ACT DESIGNATING CERTAIN PROPERTY ON THE BACK RIVER IN THE TOWN OF WEYMOUTH AS THE ABIGAIL ADAMS STATE PARK AND DESIGNATING A FACILITY LOCATED THEREON IN HONOR OF MARY F. TOOMEY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The riverfront parcel of land situated at 800 Bridge Street on
2 the northerly side of Bridge street adjacent to the Back River in
3 the Town of Weymouth acquired by the Commonwealth of
4 Massachusetts through its Metropolitan District Commission and
5 being the same premises described in Document No. 40716
6 recorded in Norfolk Registry of Deeds on April 9, 1987, shall be
7 designated and known as the Abigail Adams State Park. Any
8 facility located on such parcel of land to be utilized for purposes
9 of a museum, exhibition of area artifacts, displays of natural
10 wildlife or vegetation, or the like, shall be designated in honor
11 of Mary F. Toomey in recognition of her extraordinary devotion
12 and commitment to preservation of the Back River, Suitable
13 markers bearing said designations shall be place thereon by the
14 Metropolitan District Commission.
