The committee on Commerce and Labor, to whom was referred the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 86) of Mary L. Padula, Norman Jefferson and Dominick Panzarella for legislation relative to determining eligibility for reemployment assistance benefits; the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 93) of Martin T. Reilly for legislation to increase the eligibility period of employee benefits in plant closings; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1779) of Robert J. Jakubowicz and another for legislation to mitigate the effects of mass unemployment and economic hardship from mass termination of employees by providing for advance notification and assistance to affected communities and such employees; and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1780) of Robert F. Jakubowicz and another for legislation to further regulate the voluntary standards of corporate behavior by certain employees doing business with public agencies, reports the accompanying order (Senate, No. 1798).

2 authorized to sit during the recess of the General Court to make
3 an investigation and study of Senate documents numbered S.93,
4 and S.86, and House documents numbered H1779, and H1780,
5 relative to Mature Industries.

6 Said committee shall report to the General Court the results
7 of its investigation and study, and its recommendations, if any,
8 together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such
9 recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the Clerk
10 of the Senate on or before the last Wednesday in December,
11 nineteen hundred and eighty-seven.
