The committee on the Judiciary, to whom was referred the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 921) of Paul J. Sheehy for legislation to establish May twenty-ninth as a legal holiday; the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 941) of William G. Marot, William E. Moriarty and Robert D. Wetmore for legislation to make John F. Kennedy's birthday a legal holiday; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 344) of Marie J. Parente, Thomas W. McGee and another that March twentieth of each year be designated as a legal holiday in honor of John Fitzgerald Kennedy; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3749) of Gregory W. Sullivan that May twenty-ninth be declared a legal holiday in observance of the birth of John Fitzgerald Kennedy; and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4433) of James P. Coughlin relative to establishing Inauguration Day of the President and Vice President as a legal holiday in honor of John F. Kennedy, reports the accompanying resolve (Senate, No. 1887).

RESOLVE INCREASING THE SCOPE OF THE SPECIAL COMMISSION ESTABLISHED TO MAKE AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY RELATIVE TO A SUITABLE MEMORIAL TO PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY.

1 *Resolved*, That the special commission establishing a suitable

3 chapter 6 of the Resolve of 1983 and revived and continued under
4 chapter 1 of the Resolves of 1985 is hereby authorized to
5 investigate current Senate documents numbered 921, 941, and
6 current House documents numbered 344, 3749, 4433 relative to
7 establishing May twenty-ninth as a legal holiday.
