AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE OFFICE FOR CHILDREN TO LICENSE PROGRAMS FOR ADOLESCENTS SIXTEEN TO EIGHTEEN YEARS OLD.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 2 of Chapter 28A is hereby amended by deleting the
2 definition for "child" and inserting the following definition: —
3 "child", any person under the age of eighteen or under the age
4 of twenty-two if such child is a child with special needs.

5 Section 9 of Chapter 28A, as appearing in the 1984 Official
6 Edition, is hereby amended by deleting the word "sixteen" in lines
7 sixty three, sixty nine and ninety four and substituting in place
8 thereof the word "eighteen".

9 Section 14 of said chapter is further amended by deleting the
10 word "sixteen" in line four and substituting in place thereof the
11 word "eighteen".
