AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE BOARD OF REGISTRATION IN VETERINARY MEDICINE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 56 A of chapter 112 of the General Laws,
2 as appearing in the 1986 Official Edition, is hereby amended by
3 striking out the second sentence of the first paragraph and insert-
4 ing in place thereof the following sentence: —

5 Such temporary permit may be granted for a period of six
6 months and may be renewed once for a period of six months,
7 provided, that said person write the next set of examinations and
8 also provided that said person is employed by and practices under
9 the district supervision and control of a duly licensed veterinarian
10 practicing in the Commonwealth.

1 SECTION 2. Said section 56A is hereby further amended by
2 striking out the second sentence of the second paragraph and
3 inserting in place thereof the following sentence: —

4 Such temporary permit may be granted for a period of six
5 months and may also be renewed once for a period of six months
6 and may be summarily revoked by a majority vote of the board.
