AN ACT EXEMPTING CERTAIN RETIREMENT ALLOWANCES FROM ESTATE TAXES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 19 of chapter 32 of the General Laws is hereby amended
2 by striking out the third sentence, as appearing in chapter 691 of
3 the acts of 1956, and inserting in place thereof the following
4 sentence: — That portion of the estate of any deceased member
5 consisting of any sum or sums received from any system under
6 the provisions of sections one to twenty-eight, inclusive, shall not
7 be included in computing any legacy or succession tax under the
8 provisions of Chapter sixty-five or estate tax under the provisions
9 of chapter sixty-five C.

The Committee on Education

in answer to a resolution passed on the 11th day of February, 1903

relating to the proposed amendments to the Constitution of the United States

Section 10 of Article II of the United States Constitution provides that the President shall have the honor and power of appointing and receiving Ambassadors, Ministers, and Consuls, Judges, and other Officers of the United States, subject to the Advice and Consent of the Senate, which shall have the Power to reject, or to give its Advice and Consent to the Appointment, with the Power to grant Reprieves and Pardons for Offenses against the United States, except in Cases of Impeachment.
