AN ACT AMENDING CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTION RESTRICTIONS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 13 of chapter 55 of the General Laws, is hereby amended  
2 by striking out the first sentence and inserting in place thereof the  
3 following sentence: — No person employed for compensation,  
4 other than an elected officer, by the commonwealth or any county,  
5 city or town shall directly or indirectly solicit or receive any gift,  
6 payment, contribution, assessment, subscription or promise of  
7 money or other thing of value for the political campaign purposes  
8 of any candidate for public office or of any political committee,  
9 or for any political purpose whatever, but this section shall not  
10 prevent such persons from soliciting or receiving campaign  
11 contributions for multi-candidate committees or referendum  
12 committees and of being members of political organizations or  
13 committees.
