AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE STATE STAFF OF THE MILITIA.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Subsection (d) of section 15 of chapter 33 of the
2 General Laws, as appearing in the 1984 Official Edition, is hereby
3 amended by adding the following sentence: —

4 There shall be one full-time assistant state quartermaster who
5 shall perform such duties as may be delegated to him by the state
6 quartermaster or as prescribed in orders and regulations from time
7 to time.

1 SECTION 2. Subsection (j) of said section 15 of chapter 33,
2 as appearing in the 1984 Official Edition, is hereby amended by
3 striking out, in line 12, the word "colonel" and inserting in place
4 thereof the words: — brigadier general.

1 SECTION 3. Said subsection (j) of said section 15 of said chap-
2 ter 33 is hereby further amended by inserting, after the word
3 "colonel", in line 12, the words: — ; the assistant state quarter-
4 master, the same pay as an officer of the regular service of cor-
5 responding grade with the corresponding length of service but not
6 exceeding that of colonel.
