AN ACT PROVIDING FOR LEAVE WITHOUT LOSS OF PAY FOR CERTAIN INCAPACITATED COUNTY EMPLOYEES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 41, Section 111F is hereby amended by adding to the
- 2 first paragraph thereof the following new sentence: — “This
- 3 section shall also apply to any employee of a county whose regular
- 4 or incidental duties require the care, supervision or custody of
- 5 prisoners, criminally insane persons or defective delinquents.”
