AN ACT INCREASING THE NUMBER OF COURT OFFICERS IN THE DISTRICT COURT OF HAMPSHIRE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 62 of Chapter 218 of the Massachusetts
2 General Laws is hereby amended by striking out the words
3 "district court of Hampshire" in clause (9), and inserting the words
4 "district court of Hampshire" after the words "district court of
5 Somerville" in clause (7), and said section is further amended by
6 adding the words "district court of eastern Hampshire" at the end
7 of clause (9).

1 SECTION 2. Section 30 of Chapter 217 of the General Laws
2 is hereby amended by adding the word, "Hampshire" after the
3 word "Essex" in line three of said section.

The Constitution of the State

A Bill for the Amendment of the Constitution of the State
