AN ACT REQUIRING PROMPT NOTICE OF SURCHARGES TO INSURED.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 The tenth paragraph of section 2 of chapter 90 of the General  
2 Laws, as appearing in the 1984 Official Edition, is hereby amended  
3 by inserting at the end thereof the following: — provided,  
4 however, such rules shall require that insurers shall notify insureds  
5 of the imposition of a surcharge within sixty days of the incident  
6 give rise to such surcharge.
