AN ACT REQUIRING PERSONS CONVICTED OF DRUNK DRIVING TO PURCHASE CERTAIN LEVELS OF BODILY INJURY INSURANCE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 90 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting
- 2 after section 24J the following section: —
- 3 Section 24K. Every person who is convicted of operating a
- 4 motor vehicle under the influence of intoxicating liquor pursuant
- 5 to the provisions of section twenty-four shall, as a condition of
- 6 operating a motor vehicle in the commonwealth, purchase and
- 7 keep in effect bodily injury insurance coverage in the amount of
- 8 \$100,000 per person, \$300,000 per accident for six years following
- 9 such conviction. The commissioner of insurance shall establish
- 10 fair, equitable, and reasonable rates for such coverage.
