AN ACT RELATIVE TO FLUORIDATION OF WATER SUPPLIES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The first paragraph of section 8C of chapter 111
2 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 1984 Official Edition,
3 is hereby amended by striking out the second sentence and
4 inserting in place thereof the following sentence: — If the town
5 or city's health department determines by a scientifically
6 conducted decayed, missing and filled study that the dental health
7 of said community is at such level that additional preventive
8 measures are deemed necessary for sound dental health, such
9 health board shall make their findings known to the
10 commissioner.

1 SECTION 2. The third sentence of said first paragraph of said
2 section 8C of chapter 111 of the General Laws as so appearing,
3 is hereby amended by striking out all after the word "jurisdiction,"
4 and inserting in place thereof the following words: — petition the
5 state for a voluntary preventive dental health program to meet
6 the needs of that community with the cooperation of the state
7 through its preventive block grant funds.
