AN ACT ELIMINATING THE REQUIREMENT FOR A HEARING FOR A SIXTY DAY SUSPENSION OF A LICENSE OR RIGHT TO OPERATE A MOTOR VEHICLE FOR SEVEN AT-FAULT ACCIDENTS OR CONVICTIONS OF MOVING VIOLATIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 113 B of chapter 175 of the 1986 edition of the General
2 Laws is hereby amended by striking out the sentence beginning
3 at line 151 with the word "upon" and ending on line 159 with the
4 phrase "sixty days" and inserting in place thereof the following
5 sentence: — Upon receiving accurate notification from said merit
6 rating board that a person has received seven at-fault accidents
7 or convictions of moving volations of motor vehicle laws,
8 including payments pursuant to chapter ninety C and assignments
9 to driver alcohol education programs under the provisions of
10 section twenty-four D of chapter ninety during any three year
11 period, the registry shall suspend the license or right to operate
12 a motor vehicle for sixty days which suspension shall be in
13 addition to any other suspension of said license or right to operate
14 imposed under any other general or special law and the suspension
15 hereunder is to run consecutively with any other such suspension.
