The committee on Transportation, to whom were referred the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 684) of Joseph R. Pierro that the Woods Hole, Martha's Vineyard and Nantucket Steamship Authority be directed to provide half fares for handicapped persons confined to wheelchairs using the facilities of said authority, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 685) of Joseph R. Pierro that the Woods Hole, Martha's Vineyard and Nantucket Steamship Authority be directed to provide free parking for certain handicapped persons using the facilities of said authority, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 686) of Joseph R. Pierro that the Woods Hole, Martha's Vineyard and Nantucket Steamship Authority be directed to permit persons sixty-five years of age or over to use the facilities of said authority at half fare, and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3373) of Howard C. Cahoon, Jr., and another for legislation to authorize the purchase of a new vessel by the Woods Hole, Martha's Vineyard and Nantucket Steamship Authority, reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 5464) ought to be adopted.

3 investigation and study of House documents numbered 684, 685,

7 of its investigation and study, and its recommendations, if any,
8 together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such
9 recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the Clerk
10 of the House of Representatives on or before the last Wednesday
11 in December, nineteen hundred and eighty-eight.
