Walsh for legislation to establish a matching grant program to enable cities to develop innovative housing rehabilitation programs, the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 475) of Frederick E. Berry, Kevin W. Fitzgerald, William B. Golden and Thomas P. Walsh for legislation to establish the Massachusetts homestead program, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1127) of Barbara E. Gray that housing authorities be granted the authorization to introduce mutual housing programs to cities and towns, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1129) of Barbara E. Gray and Robert J. Bohigian for legislation to include low income single persons in the housing assistance program, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2091) of Henry R. Grenier for legislation to provide low and moderate income persons with financial assistance for weatherization and other related home improvements, and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2263) of Michael W. Morrissey relative to occupancy by veterans in state aided low rent housing projects, reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 5529) ought to be adopted.

6 Executive Office of Communities and Development.

7 Said committee shall report to the General Court the results
8 of its investigation and study, and its recommendations, if any,
9 together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such
10 recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the Clerk
11 of the House of Representatives on or before the last Wednesday
12 in December, nineteen hundred and eighty-eight.
