Emilio for legislation to permit payment for services of appointed members of the Massachusetts Water Resources Authority, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1391) of M. Joseph Manning for legislation to further regulate the compensation of any person serving in the temporary position of director of apprentice training in the Department of Labor and Industries, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1939) of Steven Angelo, Peter C. Webber, William P. Nagle, Jr., and John F. MacGovern relative to the compensation and travel allowances for members of the Board of Food and Agriculture, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2176) of Steven Angelo, Peter C. Webber and William P. Nagle, Jr., for legislation to facilitate the administration of the Department of Food and Agriculture, and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2982) of the Massachusetts District Attorneys' Association and Michael F. Flaherty for legislation relative to the salaries of district attorneys, reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 5785) ought to be adopted.

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1     *Ordered,* That the committee on Public Service be authorized  
2 to sit during the recess of the General Court to make an  
3 investigation and study of Senate documents numbered 1088 and  
4 House documents numbered 5, 219, 220, 1391, 1939, 2176, and  
5 2982, relative to the per diem compensation and expenses payable  
6 to the members of the various boards, commissions, and councils  
7 established by special or general laws.

8     Said committee shall report to the General Court the results  
9 of its investigation and study, and its recommendations, if any,  
10 together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such  
11 recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the Clerk  
12 of the House of Representatives on or before the last Wednesday  
13 in December, nineteen hundred and eighty-eight.
