### AN ACT AMENDING THE INDUSTRIAL SERVICES PROGRAM.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 71D of Chapter 151A of the General  
2 Laws is hereby amended by striking the third sentence and  
3 inserting the following: —

4 Subject to appropriation, said reemployment assistance  
5 program shall be administered by the secretary of labor and the  
6 secretary of economic affairs through the industrial services  
7 program.

8 There is no change in the fourth sentence.

1 SECTION 2. Section 8 of Chapter 23D of the General Laws  
2 is hereby amended by striking the first sentence and inserting the  
3 following: —

4 There shall be in the executive office of labor, but not subject  
5 to its jurisdiction, an economic stabilization trust administered by  
6 the secretary of labor and the secretary of economic affairs.

7 There is no change to the second sentence.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES

Article I, Section 1

All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

Section 3. The Senate of the United States shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Legislature thereof, for six Years; and each Senator shall have the Qualifications requisite for Senators of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

Section 4. The Times, Places and Manner of holding the Elections of Senators and Representatives, shall be prescribed in each State by the Legislature thereof; but the Congress may at any time by Law alter or add to the Rules and Regulations of the foregoing Elections.

Section 5. The Congress shall assemble at least once in every Year, and such Meeting shall be held in the City of Washington, District of Columbia, and on such Day of the Month of September as they shall by Law provide; but the Congress may by Law or Resolution alter the Day of the Year.

Section 6. The Senators and Representatives shall receive Compensation for their Services, as well as Allowances for Expenses actually incurred while they are so serving, which shall be ascertained in such Manner as they shall by Law provide; but they shall, in any Case, hold their Offices without Salary.

Section 7. No Senator or Representative shall be in any Manner impeached or expelled from the Congress unless by a two thirds Vote of both Houses thereof.
