AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR CERTAIN NOTICES UPON THE DISCHARGE OF A PERSON FROM THE MASSACHUSETTS TREATMENT CENTER.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 9 of Chapter 123A of the General Laws, as appearing
2 in the 1986 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out
3 the last sentence, beginning at line thirty-four: Upon such dis-
4 charge, notice must be given to the center, the commissioner of
5 mental health, corrections and public safety, the attorney general,
6 the district attorney in the district from which the commitment
7 first originated, the police department for the town of
8 Bridgewater, the police department for the municipality where the
9 person was last arrested, and the police department or depart-
10 ments for the municipality or municipalities where the person is
11 anticipated to live, work and/or attend school or other training.
