AN ACT AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE TREASURER OF THE COMMONWEALTH TO REIMBURSE THE TOWN OF COHASSET FOR MASSACHUSETTS BAY TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY ASSESSMENT FOR FISCAL YEAR NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-FIVE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 The state treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to reim-
- 2 burse the town of Cohasset for any Massachusetts Bay
- 3 Transportation Authority assessment for fiscal year nineteen
- 4 hundred and eighty-five not to exceed the sum of ninety-six thou-
- 5 sand seven hundred and twelve dollars.

By the House of Representatives of the United States of America, in Conference with the Senate, approved August 1, 1901.

The Constitution of the United States

As amended by the Thirteenth, Fourteenth, Fifteenth, and Nineteenth Amendments.

Article I. Section 1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch in that State.

Section 3. The Senate of the United States shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Legislature thereof, for a Term of six Years; and each Senator shall have the Qualifications requisite for Senators of the most numerous Branch in that State.
