

AN ACT MAKING THE SUPERINTENDENT OF REFUSE AND GARBAGE AND THE CITY ELECTRICIAN MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION ON WAYS AND DRAINAGE IN THE CITY OF LYNN. Chap.308

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section 22 of chapter 340 of the Special Acts of 1917, as most recently amended by section 1 of chapter 487 of the acts of 1943, is hereby further amended by striking out the first sentence and inserting in place thereof the following sentence:— The mayor, city engineer, superintendent of streets, commissioner of water supply, superintendent of sewers, superintendent of refuse and garbage and the city electrician, and the four members of the city council who are elected at large, shall constitute a commission on ways and drainage, of which the mayor shall be chairman.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its acceptance during the current year by vote of said commission on ways and drainage, but not otherwise.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF MEDFORD TO APPROPRIATE AND PAY A SUM OF MONEY TO VINCENT AMOROSO TO REIMBURSE HIM FOR CERTAIN MEDICAL EXPENSES. Chap.309

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. For the purpose of discharging a moral obligation, the city of Medford is hereby authorized to appropriate and pay the sum of eighty dollars to Vincent Amoroso of said city to reimburse him for medical expenses incurred as a result of injuries sustained in the line of duty as a police officer of said city.

SECTION 2. This act shall take full effect upon its acceptance by vote of the city council of said city, subject to the provisions of its charter, but not otherwise.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE USE OF CERTAIN MATERIALS UPON PUBLIC RECORDS. Chap.310

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

Section 4 of chapter 66 of the General Laws, as appearing in the Tercentenary Edition, is hereby amended by striking out, in line 4, the words "or stamping pad" and inserting in place thereof the words:— , stamping pad or carbon paper, — so as to read as follows:— *Section 4.* No ink shall be used upon any public record except ink furnished by the supervisor of records, and no ribbon, pad or other device used for printing by typewriting machines, or stamping pad, or any ink contained in such ribbon, pad, device, stamping pad or carbon paper, shall be used upon any public record, nor shall any photographic machine or device or chemical
