**Chap.311** AN ACT PLACING THE INCUMBENT OF THE POSITION OF SENIOR REGISTRAR IN THE MUNICIPAL EMPLOYMENT BUREAU OF THE CITY OF BOSTON UNDER THE CIVIL SERVICE LAWS AND RULES.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. On and after the effective date of this act, the provisional incumbent of the position of senior registrar in the municipal employment bureau of the city of Boston shall be considered to be properly classified under the civil service law and rules as a junior employment registrar, subject to passing a qualifying examination to which he shall be subjected by the division of civil service.

SECTION 2. The person referred to in section one of this act shall not be subjected to any probationary period; provided, that he passes the qualifying examination as provided in said section one.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its acceptance by the city council of said city, subject to the provisions of its charter, but not otherwise. *Approved April 10, 1950.*

**Chap.312** AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE RESTORATION OF A CERTAIN PERSON TO THE ELIGIBLE LIST FOR POLICE OFFICERS IN THE CITY OF HOLYOKE.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. The director of civil service is hereby authorized and directed, at the request of the mayor of the city of Holyoke, to restore James J. Stack to the existing eligible list for police entrance service in the police department of said city without examination and in accordance with the civil service laws and rules, for the remainder of the period of eligibility of the existing eligible list.

SECTION 2. This act shall take full effect upon its acceptance, during the current year, by vote of the city council of said city, subject to the provisions of its charter, but not otherwise. *Approved April 10, 1950.*

**Chap.313** AN ACT PROVIDING FOR NON-PARTISAN TOWN ELECTIONS IN THE TOWN OF RANDOLPH.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. No primary or caucus for the nomination of town officers in the town of Randolph shall be held. No
