AN ACT FREEZING REAL ESTATE TAXES ON CERTAIN PERSONS WHO HAVE ATTAINED THE AGE OF SEVENTY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 59 of the General Laws is hereby amended by insert-
- 2 ing after section 19 the following section: —
- 3 Section 19A. No person entitled to an abatement under clause
- 4 forty-one of section five shall be assessed for any property tax in
- 5 any year which is greater in amount than the tax he paid on such
- 6 property in the previous year.

Section 1. That the Act to Organize the Department of the Interior, approved August 10, 1849, be amended so that the words "and for other purposes" be stricken out, and the words "and for other purposes" be inserted in lieu thereof.
