AN ACT TO PROVIDE DISTINCTIVE REGISTRATION PLATES FOR SURVIVORS OF THE PEARL HARBOR ATTACK.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 2 of Chapter 90, as appearing in the 1986 Official  
2 Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the word  
3 "individual" in line 148, the following: — The registrar of motor  
4 vehicles may issue without charge, to the survivors of the Pearl  
5 Harbor attack on December 7, 1941, upon presentation of  
6 satisfactory evidence of such military service at that location  
7 during the attack, as determined by the registrar, distinctive  
8 registration plates for one pleasure vehicle owned and principally  
9 used by said individual.
