AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE RETIREMENT RIGHTS OF CERTAIN COUNTY EMPLOYEES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 32 of the General Laws, as most recently
2 amended, is hereby further amended by adding following Section
3 28L the following new Section: —

4 Section 28M. Notwithstanding any provision of the law to the
5 contrary, any employee of a county whose major responsibilities
6 include the care and custody of prisoners and who has performed
7 service as a county correction officer for not less than twenty years
8 shall, at his own request, be retired by said retirement board.

9 The retirement allowances under this section shall be the same
10 as those provided for in paragraph (c) of subdivision (3) of section
11 twenty-six.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect on passage.
