AN ACT INCREASING THE SALARIES OF DISTRICT ATTORNEYS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 12 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by striking out section 15, as most recently amended by
3 section 2 of Chapter 723 of the acts of 1987, and inserting in place
4 thereof the following section: —

5 Section 15. District Attorneys shall devote their entire time
6 during ordinary business hours to their duties, shall neither
7 directly nor indirectly engage in the practice of law, and receive
8 from the Commonwealth a salary equivalent to the salary paid
9 to the Chief Administrative Justice of the Trial Court.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect as of July first, nineteen
2 hundred and eighty-eight.
