AN ACT REPEALING THE INVESTMENT INCOME TAX ON CERTAIN INSURANCE COMPANIES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 2 Laws, as appearing in the nineteen hundred and eighty-four
- 3 Official Edition, is hereby repealed.
