criteria shall not be barred from consideration as a disadvantaged person by reason of his receiving a salary from the commonwealth or its political subdivisions; and provided, further, that a public service employment enrollee who is unsuitably employed as defined by regulations promulgated pursuant to the Comprehensive Employment and Training Act shall not be barred from consideration as a disadvantaged person by reason of the amount of his salary.

The provisions of this act shall not apply to positions in the police or fire services.

The division of personnel administration shall be available to assist in designing training programs to meet stated specifications of the positions for which person referred to in this act are trained.

SECTION 2. This act shall cease to be operative on June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and eighty-two.

Chap. 566. AN ACT INCREASING THE STIPEND FOR THE ELDER SERVICE CORPS.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Clause (2) of section 13 of chapter 19A of the General Laws, as appearing in section 15 of chapter 1168 of the acts of 1973, is hereby amended by inserting after the word "hundred", in line 4, the words:- and ten.

Chap. 567. AN ACT DIRECTING THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION TO RESERVE A SITE FOR A STATUE MEMORIALIZING ARTHUR FIEDLER.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

The metropolitan district commission is hereby authorized and directed to locate and reserve a site for a statue at the Hatch memorial shell located in the Charles river reservation in the city of Boston, in memory of Arthur Fiedler, the father of the Boston Pops.

Chap. 568. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION TO GRANT A PERMANENT PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAY OVER A CERTAIN PARCEL OF LAND IN THE TOWN OF FRAMINGHAM.
