AN ACT RELATIVE TO FILING STATEMENTS WITH APPROPRIATE OFFICERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 24 of chapter 55 of the General Laws, as most recently
2 amended by section 9 of Chapter 10 of the Acts of 1988, is hereby
3 further amended by striking said section and inserting the
4 following: —

5 Section 24. If the statement required to be filed by a candidate,
6 treasurer or other person relates to a nomination or election to
7 a city or town office, or to a question appearing upon the official
8 ballot used at a city or town election, the statement shall be filed
9 with the clerk of the city or town involved; if the statement
10 required to be filed by a candidate, treasurer or other person
11 relates to a nomination or election for the office of regional district
12 school committee member elected district-wide, the statement
13 shall be filed with the clerk of the city or town where the candidate
14 is a registered voter; if the statement required to be filed by a
15 candidate, treasurer or other person relates to a nomination or
16 election for district office as provided in section 113 to 119 of
17 chapter forty-one, the statement shall be filed with the clerk of
18 the district; all other such statements shall be filed with the
19 director. All such statements shall be signed under the penalties
20 of perjury.
