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AN ACT REQUIRING INSURANCE PAYMENTS FOR BOTULINUM-A TOXIN.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Patients receiving the drug known as botulinum-A toxin, for the
- 2 treatment of Strabismus, Benign Essential Blepharospasms,
- 3 Meige's Disease, Spastic Dysphonia and disorders related to the
- 4 preceding disorders shall be reimbursed for the cost of treatment
- 5 with that drug by their health insurance provider. Reimbursement
- 6 shall be made in the same manner as that provided for F.D.A.
- 7 approved drugs.
