RESOLVE FOR AN INVESTIGATION BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION RELATIVE TO THE DEVELOPMENT OF A REORGANIZATION PLAN OF EMPLOYMENT/TRAINING SERVICES FOR HANDICAPPED PERSONS.

1 *Resolved*, That a special commission be established for the
2 purpose of making an investigation and study relative to the
3 development of a reorganization plan of employment/training
4 services for handicapped persons. The special commission shall
5 consist of three members of the senate, six members of the house,
6 and four members to be appointed by the governor, one of whom
7 shall be a member of the office of handicapped affairs.

8 Said investigation and study shall include, but not be limited
9 to, the number of agencies currently involved in employment and
10 training services for handicapped persons, and documentation by
11 the office of handicapped affairs on the number of persons not
12 being served adequately by the current system. The commission
13 would recommend a new employment/training system by which
14 the handicapped population would be better served, and to
15 propose legislation pursuant thereto.

16 The commission shall hold hearings around the commonwealth
17 and file its report containing the results of its investigation and
18 study and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of
19 legislation by filing the same with the clerk of the house of repre-
20 sentatives from time to time, but no later than the first Wednes-
21 day in November, nineteen hundred and ninety.
