

park, so called, in said town for a public way and to relocate, lay out, construct and maintain over a portion of said park a public way called Whites avenue, said portion being shown as a strip of land approximately twenty feet wide extending along the southeasterly side of Whites avenue in said Watertown from Main street to land of the Boston & Maine Railroad, as shown on a plan on file in the office of the town engineer of said town entitled "Town of Watertown Plan Showing Portion of Saltonstall Park," dated May 24, 1950, by Herbert C. Cook, Town Engineer, bounded and described as follows:

Southwesterly by Main street as shown on said plan, fifty-eight and 18/100 feet;

Northwesterly by Whites avenue as shown on said plan, five hundred feet more or less;

Northeasterly by land of Boston & Maine Railroad — Fitchburg Division — as shown on said plan, 20 feet;

Southeasterly by land of the town of Watertown as shown on said plan, five hundred and twenty-three and 97/100 feet more or less.

Containing about 10,300 square feet of land according to said plan.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its acceptance by the town by a vote of a majority of the members present at an annual or special town meeting called for the purpose.

**Chap.567 AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF DARTMOUTH TO MAKE ADDITIONAL WATER LOANS.**

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. For the purpose of constructing water towers, extending water mains and improving water distribution facilities, the town of Dartmouth may borrow from time to time such sums as may be necessary, not exceeding, in the aggregate, five hundred thousand dollars, and may issue bonds or notes therefor which shall bear on their face the words, Dartmouth Water Loan, Act of 1950. Each authorized issue shall constitute a separate loan and such loans shall be payable in not more than thirty years. Indebtedness incurred under this act shall be within the limits of the amount prescribed by the last paragraph of section eight of chapter forty-four of the General Laws.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
