

*Chap.619* AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE CREATION OF A DEVELOPMENT AND INDUSTRIAL COMMISSION FOR THE CITY OF GLOUCESTER.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law to the contrary the city of Gloucester may appropriate annually for a period of three years commencing in the current year, a sum not exceeding ten thousand dollars in any one year, for the purpose of creating a development and industrial commission for the promotion and development of the industrial resources of said city. The commission shall conduct researches into industrial conditions and shall seek to co-ordinate the activities of unofficial bodies organized for said purposes, and may advertise, prepare, print and distribute books, maps, charts and pamphlets which in its judgment will further the purposes for which it is created. In carrying out the provisions of this act the commission may appoint such experts, clerks and employees as it may require; provided, that said appointees shall not be subject to the provisions of chapter thirty-one of the General Laws. Members of the commission or its authorized agents may travel within or without the commonwealth for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this act. Appointments and money expended hereunder shall be under the direction of the mayor and city council in accordance with its charter.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

*Chap.620* AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE DESIGNATION BY THE STATE TREASURER OF CERTAIN PAYMENTS BY THE COMMONWEALTH TO TOWNS FOR SCHOOL AID.

Emergency preamble.

*Whereas*, The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is to make the provisions therein contained effective forthwith, therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the preservation of the public convenience.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

State treasurer to designate payments as "School aid, etc."

Section 10 of chapter 70 of the General Laws, as appearing in section 1 of chapter 643 of the acts of 1948, is hereby amended by adding at the end the following sentence:— All amounts paid to any town under this chapter shall at the time of payment be accompanied by a written statement from the state treasurer designating such payments as "School aid according to chapter seventy of the General Laws" and stating the amount of the payment.
