AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF BEVERLY TO GRANT A PENSION TO A WIDOW OF A CERTAIN PUBLIC EMPLOYEE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any contrary provision of law
2 and for the purpose of promoting the public good, in recognition
3 of 32 years of meritorious service, the City of Beverly, as of
4 October 1987 shall grant to Nancy Carpenter, widow of police
5 officer David Carpenter, an annual retirement allowance equal
6 to the amount she would have received if said officer retired in
7 accordance with the provisions of Section 12, subdivision (2),
8 Option (c), Chapter 32 of the General Laws.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
