AN ACT REQUIRING CRIMINAL RECORD INFORMATION CHECKS FOR CERTAIN EMPLOYEES WITHIN THE EXECUTIVE OFFICE OF HUMAN SERVICES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 16 of Chapter 6A of the General Laws as amended by
2 Section 1 of Chapter 23 of the Acts of 1988, is hereby further
3 amended by adding at the end thereof the following sentences: —
4 The secretary shall also direct the implementation of the
5 criminal offender record information system, as defined by section
6 one hundred and sixty-eight of Chapter six, by all agencies within
7 the executive office which contract for or provide direct care
8 services to minors. All applicants for employment who provide
9 direct services to minors and those current and future contracted
10 employees of agencies who provide human service programs to
11 minors, shall be reviewed by the criminal offender record
12 information system. Such review shall be a condition of
13 employment or contract with the Commonwealth.
