

that such rules and regulations shall be consistent with all laws in relation to the protection of birds and mammals. No such regulation shall prohibit hunting within said lands except the hunting of deer. Whoever violates any provision of any such rule or regulation shall be punished by a fine of not more than twenty-five dollars. The aforesaid rules and regulations may be enforced by any state police officer, by any town police officer or by any constable, sheriff or deputy sheriff empowered to serve criminal process.

Chap.769 AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTION TO ESTABLISH A CLINIC AT THE STATE FARM FOR THE DIAGNOSIS AND TREATMENT OF CERTAIN PERSONS SUFFERING FROM CHRONIC ALCOHOLISM.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

G. L. (Ter. Ed.), 125, new § 48A, added.
Department may establish a clinic for alcoholics.

Chapter 125 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 48 the following section:— *Section 48A.* The department of correction is hereby authorized and directed to establish and maintain at the state farm, in accordance with standards fixed by the department of public health, a clinic for the examination, diagnosis and treatment of chronic alcoholics sentenced to said farm for drunkenness. The professional personnel of said clinic shall be appointed by the department of correction with the advice and approval of the public health council of the department of public health. Any person who has received an examination or treatment at such clinic shall, upon his release from said farm, be referred for further treatment to an alcoholic clinic established by the department of public health.

Chap.770 AN ACT INCREASING THE SALARY OF THE COMMISSIONER OF PUBLIC WELFARE.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

G. L. (Ter. Ed.), 18, § 2, etc., amended.

Commissioner of public welfare.

Salary.

Section 2 of chapter 18 of the General Laws, as amended by section 23 of chapter 591 of the acts of 1946, is hereby further amended by striking out, in line 7, the word "eight" and inserting in place thereof the word:— ten, — so as to read as follows:— *Section 2.* The department shall be under the supervision and control of a commissioner of public welfare, who shall be its executive and administrative head, and an advisory board consisting of the commissioner, ex officio, and six appointive members, of whom two shall be women. The commissioner shall receive such salary, not exceeding ten thousand dollars, as the governor and council determine. Upon the expiration of his term of office, his successor shall be appointed for five years by the governor, with the advice and consent of the council.
