AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE APPOINTMENT OF SPECIAL POLICE OFFICERS IN THE TOWN OF EASTHAMPTON.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The town administrator may appoint, pursuant
2 to Article 4, Section 4-2 (3) of the Easthampton Home Rule
3 Charter, such special police officers for the town of Easthampton
4 as he deems necessary for the safety and protection of the citizens
5 of said town.

1 SECTION 2. Said special police officers shall have the same
2 power to make arrests and to perform other police functions as
3 do intermittent police officers of the town and shall be subject
4 to the same training requirements as said intermittent officers.

1 SECTION 3. Said special police officers shall be appointed for
2 an indefinite term, subject to removal by the town administrator.
3 Said special police officers shall be sworn before the town clerk
4 of Easthampton who shall keep a record of all such appointments.

1 SECTION 4. Special police officers appointed under the
2 provisions of this act shall not be subject to the provisions of
3 chapter thirty-one of the General Laws.

1 SECTION 5. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
