AN ACT REVIVING AND EXTENDING A CERTAIN CIVIL SERVICE LIST OF THE CITY OF CHELSEA.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law
2 to the contrary, the eligible civil service list for appointment as
3 reserve police officer in the police department of the city of
4 Chelsea which expired on June sixth, nineteen hundred and
5 eighty-eight shall be revived and extended to April first, nineteen
6 hundred and eighty-nine.
