AN ACT CONTINUING THE POWER OF THE INSPECTOR GENERAL TO
SUBPOENA WITNESSES.

1 *Whereas*, The deferred operation of this act would tend to
2 defeat its purpose, which is to continue the power of the inspector
3 general to summons the attendance and testimony under oath of
4 certain persons, therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency
5 law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
6 convenience.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General
Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section two of chapter one hundred and nineteen
2 of the acts of nineteen hundred and eighty-four is hereby repealed.

1 SECTION 2. Section 3 of said chapter 119 is hereby amended
2 by striking out, in lines 2 to 4, inclusive, the words "and section
3 two shall take effect on July first, nineteen hundred and eighty-
4 nine."
