## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-Nine.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT CHIEF WILLIAM GROSS MAY CONTINUE EMPLOYMENT WITH THE POLICE DEPARTMENT OF THE TOWN OF STOUGHTON.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or  
2 special law or rule to the contrary, William Gross, chief of the  
3 police department of the town of Stoughton, is hereby authorized  
4 to continue in such position until and including July thirty-first,  
5 nineteen hundred and ninety-one; provided, however, that he is  
6 mentally and physically capable of performing the duties of his  
7 office or position; and provided, further, that he shall annually,  
8 at his own expense, be examined by an impartial physician  
9 designated by the retirement board to determine such capability.  
10 No further deductions shall be made from the regular  
11 compensation of said employee under the provisions of chapter  
12 thirty-two for service subsequent to July thirty-first, nineteen  
13 hundred and eighty-nine, and upon retirement said employee shall  
14 receive a superannuation allowance equal to that to which he  
15 would have been entitled had he retired on said date.

1 SECTION 2. The provisions of this act shall take effect upon  
2 its passage.
