The committee on Government Regulations, to whom was referred the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 300) of Frederick E. Berry and Thomas C. Norton for legislation to authorize the dedication of revenue streams to the Children's Trust Fund; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2278) of Kevin W. Fitzgerald and Kevin G. Honan for legislation to authorize the State Lottery Commission to establish a lottery during the month of April of each year for benefit of the child abuse prevention fund; and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2829) of Kevin W. Fitzgerald and other members of the General Court relative to authorizing the dedication of revenue streams to the child abuse prevention fund, reports the accompanying bill (Senate, No. 1522).

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE DEDICATION OF REVENUE STREAMS TO THE CHILDREN'S TRUST FUND.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 24 of Chapter 10 of the General Laws  
2 is hereby amended by striking out the last paragraph and inserting  
3 the following: —

4 Revenue from the Lottery or the lotteries for the arts shall be  
5 distributed in accordance with the provision of section fifty-seven,  
6 except that the comptroller shall calculate the daily average of  
7 lotteries for the arts net receipts for the month of April each year  
8 and transfer an amount equal to one day of said average to the  
9 Children's Trust Fund; provided, however, that said amount shall  
10 not exceed one million dollars in any fiscal year. The Commission  
11 shall report to the governor, the attorney general, the general  
12 court, and the Massachusetts Child Abuse Prevention Board at  
13 the end of each year, the total revenues of the lotteries for the  
14 arts transferred to the Children's Trust Fund.

1 SECTION 2. All revenues credited to the child abuse  
2 prevention fund shall be administered in accordance with the  
3 provisions of section fifty of this chapter.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall expire three years from the effective  
2 date.
