AN ACT CLARIFYING EDUCATION, TRAINING AND EMPLOYMENT PROGRAMS
WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Massachusetts General Laws, chapter 127, section 48 as most
2 recently amended by 8.12 of chapter 777 the Acts of 1972 is hereby
3 amended by inserting after the last sentence in the second
4 paragraph on line 23 of section 48 of chapter 127 in the 1988
5 Official Edition of the Massachusetts General Laws the
6 following: —

7 In any educational, training or employment program involving
8 public works construction under M.G.L. Chapter 30, Sec-
9 tion 39 m, or for persons committed to the custody of the
10 department and who engage or participate in public works
11 construction to be the prevailing wage rate as determined by the
12 Commissioner of Labor and Industries pursuant to M.G.L.
13 chapter 149, section 26 as the wage rate for each category of work
14 performed by a person committed to the custody of the
15 department. The Commissioner shall petition the Commissioner
16 of the Department of Labor and Industries pursuant to M.G.L.
17 chapter 149, section 27, for the determination of prevailing wage
18 rates for any public works construction project in which a person
19 or persons committed to the custody of the department
20 participates or is engaged.
