

By Mr. Mandile of Waltham, petition of Anthony M. Mandile relative to the composition and duties of the Advisory Board of the Water Resources Authority. Natural Resources and Agriculture.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE COMPOSITION AND DUTIES OF THE ADVISORY BOARD OF THE MASSACHUSETTS WATER RESOURCES AUTHORITY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 8 of Chapter 372 of the Acts of 1984 is hereby amended
2 by adding after subsection (b) the following two paragraphs: —
3 “In addition to the above section and to the responsibilities in
4 section 23 (d) of this act, a majority vote of the advisory board
5 shall be required to approve any subsequent operating budget or
6 capital expenditure. If the advisory board shall fail to finally adopt
7 said budget and expenditures for the ensuing fiscal year on or
8 before April second, the itemized budget as proposed by the board
9 of directors together with such changes, alterations and revisions
10 as shall have been made by a majority vote of the advisory board
11 or on before June first shall constitute the approved budget for
12 the ensuing year, and the expenditure resolution shall be deemed
13 to have been passed by the advisory board as of that date.
14 “The approved budget shall govern the expenditures of the
15 district during the fiscal year. No expenses may be incurred in
16 excess of those shown in the approved budget, but the budget may
17 be from time to time amended by the preparation and submission
18 of a proposed supplementary budget by the board of directors to
19 the advisory board on district expenditures.”

3. The total amount of the cash and other assets of the District of Columbia at the close of the fiscal year 1902 was \$1,500,000.

4. The total amount of the liabilities of the District of Columbia at the close of the fiscal year 1902 was \$1,500,000.

5. The total amount of the net assets of the District of Columbia at the close of the fiscal year 1902 was \$1,500,000.

6. The total amount of the net liabilities of the District of Columbia at the close of the fiscal year 1902 was \$1,500,000.
