AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE COMMONWEALTH TO GRANT A PENSION TO
JAMES D. CROCKER.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or
2 special law or rule or regulation to the contrary, the state board
3 of retirement is hereby authorized and directed to reinstate James
4 D. Crocker as a member in service in the state employees
5 retirement system.

1 SECTION 2. Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or
2 special law or rule or regulation to the contrary and in order to
3 promote the public good, the state board of retirement is hereby
4 authorized and directed to retire James D. Crocker, a member
5 of the metropolitan district police department who as a result of
6 injuries sustained while in the performance of his duties on several
7 occasions is totally and permanently incapacitated for further
8 services as a police officer. The annual amount of pension payable
9 to James D. Crocker under this act shall be fixed in an amount
10 equal to the regular rate of compensation which would have been
11 paid had he continued in services as a police officer at the grade
12 held by him at the time of his retirement.

13 Such retirement shall become effective as of the date of his
14 reinstatement under the provisions of section one.
