AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE REGULATION OF CERTAIN AMUSEMENT RIDES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 140 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting
- 2 after section 205A the following section: —
- 3 Section 205B. In addition to the requirements of section two
- 4 hundred and five A, no person shall, by himself or an agent
- 5 operator cause to be operated a ferris wheel, carousel, inclined
- 6 railway or similar device in any city or town, unless such person
- 7 has obtained a permit for such operation from the building
- 8 inspector of such city or town.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States
in Congress assembled, that the Secretary of the Senate do publish

1. Chapter 150 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting
2. after section 251A the following section:
3. Section 251B. In addition to the requirements of section 251A
4. printed and put in an edition that is printed or is again
5. printed shall be printed a copy which, wherever printed
6. in any of the States, shall be printed in any other State, and
7. the Secretary shall be required to deposit a copy of such edition
8. in the office of the Secretary of the Senate.
