AN ACT AMENDING THE LAWS REGARDING DISTRIBUTION OF COCAINE,
SECOND OFFENSE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Subsection (d) of section 32A of chapter 94C of the General
2 Laws, as appearing in the 1990 Official Edition at lines 35 through
3 45, inclusive, is hereby amended by striking said subsection in its
4 entirety and inserting in place thereof the following: —

5 (d) Any person convicted of violating the provisions of
6 subsection (c) after one or more prior convictions of manufac-
7 turing, distributing, dispensing or possessing with intent to
8 manufacture, distribute, or dispense a controlled substance, as
9 defined in section thirty-one or of any offense of any other
10 jurisdiction, either federal, state or territorial, which is the same
11 as or necessarily includes, the elements of said offense, shall be
12 punished by a term of imprisonment in the state prison for not
13 less than five nor more than fifteen years. No sentence imposed
14 under the provisions of this section shall be for less than a
15 mandatory minimum term of imprisonment of five years, and a
16 fine of not less than two thousand five hundred nor more than
17 twenty-five thousand dollars may be imposed but not in lieu of
18 the mandatory minimum term of imprisonment, as established
19 herein.
