## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Ninety-Two.

### AN ACT PROVIDING DISTINCTIVE NUMBER PLATES FOR SURVIVORS OF THE ATTACK ON PEARL HARBOR.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The sixth paragraph of section 2 of chapter 90  
2 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 1988 Official Edition,  
3 is hereby amended by inserting after the fourth sentence the  
4 following sentence: — The registrar of motor vehicles may issue,  
5 without charge, to Pearl Harbor Survivors, defined as any regu-  
6 larly appointed, enrolled, enlisted or inducted member of the  
7 military forces of the United States who was in the Hawaiian  
8 Islands on December seventh to December eighth, nineteen  
9 hundred and forty-one, inclusive, upon presentation of satisfac-  
10 tory evidence of such status, as determined by the registrar,  
11 distinctive registration plates for one pleasure passenger vehicle  
12 owned and principally used by said individual.

1 SECTION 2. Section 33 of said chapter 90, as so appearing,  
2 is hereby amended by adding after the word, “war” in line 144,  
3 the following words: — , and Pearl Harbor Survivors.
