

By Mr. Moore of Uxbridge, petition of Richard T. Moore relative to the issuance of distinctive motor vehicle license plates to active members of the National Guard. Public Safety.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Ninety-Two.

AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE ISSUANCE OF DISTINCTIVE LICENSE PLATES FOR ACTIVE MEMBERS OF THE MASSACHUSETTS NATIONAL GUARD.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 2 of Chapter 90 of the Massachusetts
2 General Laws, as appearing in the 1988 Official Edition, is hereby
3 amended by inserting at the end thereof the following: —

4 The registrar shall issue, without an additional fee, for members
5 of the Massachusetts Army or Air National Guard, upon
6 presentation of satisfactory evidence of such status, as determined
7 by the Registrar, distinctive license plates for one pleasure
8 passenger vehicle, or van, or pick-up truck, used exclusively for
9 non-commercial purposes, owned or leased and principally used
10 by said member.

1 SECTION 2. Section 33 of Chapter 90 of the Massachusetts
2 General Laws, as appearing in the 1988 Official Edition, is hereby
3 amended by inserting at the end thereof the following: —

4 No fee shall be exacted for the registration of one pleasure
5 passenger vehicle, or a van, or pick-up truck used exclusively for
6 non-commercial purposes, owned or leased and principally used
7 by a member of the Massachusetts Army or Air National Guard
8 who is entitled to display thereon the distinctive number plates
9 authorized by Section two.
