The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Ninety-Two.

AN ACT TO PROTECT NON-RESIDENT LICENSEES.

1 *Whereas*, the deferred operation of this act would tend to
2 defeat its purpose, which is to temporarily extend forthwith the
3 period within which a temporary license to carry firearms shall
4 be valid after its expiration date, therefore it is hereby declared
5 to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation
6 of the public convenience.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding the provision of section one hundred and
2 thirty-one F of chapter one hundred and forty of the General
3 Laws, and for the purpose of section ten of chapter two hundred
4 and sixty-nine of the General Laws, an expired temporary license
5 to carry a firearm shall be deemed valid for a period not to exceed
6 ninety days after the day of expiration; provided, however, that
7 timely application has been made for renewal of said license,
8 except that the provision of this act shall not apply to any
9 temporary license to carry a firearm which has been revoked or
10 while the revocation of such license is pending.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall cease to be operative on January
2 first, nineteen hundred and ninety-four.
